The amendment has been submitted in support of bp's request to include the following activities not previously assessed:

- 1. The deployment and retrieval of transponders and marker buoys via remotely operated vehicle for positioning of an exploration drilling unit;
- 2. The deployment and retrieval of moorings for physical environment monitoring using moored monitoring instruments;
- 3. Seabed monitoring and sampling; and
- 4. Environmental (Coral and Sponge) monitoring and sampling.
