

Aviation Safety Advisor

(Consulting Services Opportunity)

The Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Offshore Petroleum Board (C-NLOPB) is the independent regulator of petroleum-related activities in the Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Offshore Area, on behalf of the federal and provincial governments. Created in 1986 through the Atlantic Accord and its implementing legislation, the C-NLOPB provides regulatory oversight of operator activities in the areas of health and safety, environmental protection, resource management and Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador benefits.

The C-NLOPB invites interested persons to submit an application for the provision of Aviation Safety consulting services of up to 40 hours per month on a contractual basis, with the flexibility to provide additional hours if required.

The Aviation Safety Advisor will report to the Board's Chief Safety Officer (CSO) and consult with the Director of Safety. This position will be required to:

- Provide advice on aviation matters to facility Safety Officers, Lead Safety Officers, Director of Safety and/or CSO
- Review helicopter operations manuals and aviation oversight programs as part of authorizations approvals
- Review Operators' audit reports of aviation programs
- Follow-up on offshore aviation incidents
- Attend Helicopter Oversight Safety Committee (HOSC) meetings on behalf of C-NLOPB and advise the CSO and Director of Safety accordingly
- Support the development of guidance
- Complete other work as mutually agreed with the C-NLOPB

Qualified candidates possess the following:

- 5 years' experience as a Pilot in Command of a rotary aircraft, preferably the Sikorsky S-92 helicopter
- Current pilot's license
- Experience in helicopter operations in the Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador offshore area
- Training/experience in helicopter Search and Rescue operations in an offshore environment
- Comprehensive knowledge of Transport Canada aviation regulations and guidelines

The following information is required with your submission:

- A detailed Curriculum Vitae
- Hours of availability
- Proposed compensation
- Three or more employment references

First consideration shall be given by the Board to submissions which:

- i. Provide employment for individuals resident in the Province, and
- ii. Offer services provided from within the Province, where those services are competitive in terms of fair market price, quality and delivery.
