

Safety Notice 2023.01- Diverter Valve Failure

PURPOSE

This Safety Notice highlights a potential safety issue with respect to inspection and maintenance of valve vents (also known as tell-tales).

BACKGROUND OF INCIDENT

A vent may be provided as a means of valve overpressure protection. Plugging of a valve vent can lead to an undetected accumulation of pressure within the valve, potentially leading to valve failure.

In October 2022, the Operator of a platform in the Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Offshore Area reported a high potential near miss whereby a valve blew apart while three workers were conducting pressure testing. The valve handle and gearbox cap travelled at a high velocity due to accumulated pressure and made contact with a platform structure some distance away. It was determined through the Operator's investigation that the valve vent was plugged and therefore unable to release the pressure that had accumulated within the valve body during pressure testing. Every Operator and Employer must ensure that all equipment, machines, devices and materials provided for use at a workplace, including any part of or accessory, are properly maintained and are safe for their intended use. In addition, as per the OHS *Regulations*, if any of the equipment, machinery or devices used at a workplace, including any of its accessories, is subject to degradation over time that could affect its safety, then a thorough safety inspection is to be carried out at least once per year.
