**Re: Notice of Change to Federal Legislation and Implications for the *Corridor Resources Inc. Drilling of an Exploration Well on the Old Harry Prospect – EL 1153* (previously EL 1105)
CEAR No. 11-01-60633**

The Government of Canada recently announced that, on August 28, 2019, the new *Impact Assessment Act* (IAA) will come into force, repealing the *Canadian Environmental Assessment Act, 2012* (CEAA 2012). The IAA contains transitional provisions that apply to projects undergoing an environmental assessment (EA) under the *Canadian Environmental Assessment Act, 1992* (the 1992 Act). This letter is to inform you of the relevant transitional provision of the IAA and its applicability to the *Corridor Resources Inc. Drilling of an Exploration Well on the Old Harry Prospect – EL 1153* (previously EL 1105) CEAR No. 11-01-60633 (the Project).

Section 178 of the IAA states: “any screening of a project commenced under the 1992 Act in respect of which the responsible authority has not, before the day on which this Act comes into force, taken a course of action under section 20 of that Act is terminated.”

Given the current status of the referenced EA for drilling on Exploration Licence 1153, the Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Offshore Petroleum Board, as the responsible authority for this EA, will not be making a decision to take a course of action before the IAA comes into force on August 28, 2019. As such, the EA will be terminated on that date.
