I agree 100% with the attached letter, written on March 25th by the Sierra Club, Save our Seas and Shores Coalition and the Ecology Action Centre.

Considering the aftermath of the Exxon Valdez oil spill and the Deep Water Horizon oil spill (to only name a few of the oil disasters that happened around the world) it is unacceptable and upsetting that Canada regulations have NOT been changed.

Having oil development projects facilitation, workers safety and environmental protection under the same roof of a Petroleum Board, that collects millions in allocating oil and gas drilling permits to oil companies, doesn't make much sense.
