Re: Electromagnetic Geoservices Canada Inc. - Environmental Assessment East Canada Controlled Source Electromagnetic (CSEM) Survey, 2014 to 2018

The Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Offshore Petroleum Board (C-NLOPB), in consultation with the Board's fishery and environmental review agencies, has reviewed the *Environmental Assessment East Canada CSEM Survey, 2014–2018 Amendment* (LGL May 10, 2017). The report is an amendment to the *Environmental Assessment East Canada CSEM Survey, 2014–2018* (LGL Limited March 2014) and the *Environmental Assessment East Canada CSEM Survey, 2014–2018 Addendum* (LGL Limited July 2, 2014) submitted in support of Electromagnetic Geoservices Canada Inc.'s (EMGS's) request to: extend the temporal scope by one year to include 2019; include the use of a solid streamer; and increase the source output from 1,250 Amperes to 10,000 Amperes.

The Environmental Assessment (EA) Amendment provides a satisfactory assessment of environmental effects associated with this activity. The C-NLOPB is of the opinion that, taking into account the implementation of mitigation measures committed to by EMGS during the environmental assessment, the project is not likely to cause significant adverse environmental effects.
