Our comment from April 11, 2017 requesting clarification on the radius of zone of influence of the magnetic and electric fields has been clarified. It would appear that the zone of influence magnetic and electric fields using the increased source output are 800 and 1400 m respectively rather than 500 and 800 m noted within the March 23 information. We have no further comment or request for clarification.
