Darren,

The options as stated by GX in the proposed amendment include:

- (1) adding a second ship to perform 2D seismic work in areas of the existing project area not covered by the first ship, and
- (2) performing 3D seismic work in a small area near the Flemish Pass.

As it is indicated in the project amendment that all mitigations identified in the original GrandSPAN EA will be applied, and that each of the ships with active source arrays will have Marine Mammal and Seabird Observers on board at all times, Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC) has no concerns with the proposed EA amendment.
