Good afternoon Darren,

As per our conversation, I have no comments with respect to the Project Amendment, as there is no mention of radio communication systems.

Radio communication systems (including antenna and their supporting structure) in such project could be considered a maritime operation, and would be similar to any other maritime vessel; where its structures are insignificant relative to the actual facility, be it on a ship or an off-shore structure.

In this instance, radio communication systems are ancillary to the main project and would not cause any significant adverse environmental effects. As such, I am requesting that consideration be given to exclude our Department from further EA related work to this project.
