SUBJECT: Inclusion of exploration licences 1151 and 1152 in the scope of the Husky Energy Exploration Drilling Project

I am writing in response to your letter of February 20, 2017, in which Husky Oil Operations Ltd. requests that the Canadian Environmental Assessment Agency (the Agency) include exploration licences (ELs) 1151 and 1152 in the scope of the Husky Energy Exploration Drilling Project (the Project). The Agency has decided to include these additional exploration licences in the scope of the Project.

The Agency has amended the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) Guidelines for the Project to add exploration drilling within ELs 1151 and 1152, as well as associated incidental activities, into the description of the Designated Project set out in Part 1, Section 3.1 of this document (attached). For clarity, all information requirements set out in the EIS Guidelines now apply to exploration drilling within ELs 1121, 1134, 1151, and 1152.
