Response to FFAW's follow-up comments on Husky's EA Review for 2013

In response to the Fish, Food and Allied Workers Union (FFAW) letter to C-NLOPB on June 25, 2013, we offer the following information, as requested.

Our analysis of the shrimp harvesting activity indicates little potential for interaction during a 5 to 10 day wellsite survey within EL 1090R during July. The attached Figure 1 illustrates the cumulative shrimp harvesting locations during July from 2005 to 2010. (The orange dotted line indicates the boundary between 3Li and 3Lt). As these data demonstrate, there is a low risk of interaction between shrimp harvesting and the wellsite survey. Figure 2 illustrates the cumulative shrimp and crab harvesting locations during July from 2005-2010.

Husky understands that licenses are issued for large areas (e.g. NAFO subdivisions 3K or 3L) and fishing activity could take place anywhere within these areas and not just at locations fished in recent years as indicated by DFO data. Therefore, a Fisheries Liaison Officer will be employed during the duration of the wellsite survey to maintain operational communication with harvesters. Husky will continue to keep fishing interests informed of proposed activities and make every effort to minimize conflict between the two ocean industries.

We also consider a low-energy, short duration wellsite survey as low risk to the results of the Industry/DFO Post Season Crab survey which typically occurs between September and November.




