Subject: Husky Energy Jeanne d'Arc Basin / Flemish Pass Regional Seismic Program, 2012-2020 and the Canadian Environmental Assessment Act, 2012

As you are aware, the *Canadian Environmental Assessment Act* (S.C. 1992, c. 37) was repealed when the *Canadian Environmental Assessment Act*, 2012 (CEAA 2012) came into force on July 6, 2012.

Please note that environmental assessment (EA) for the *Husky Energy Jeanne d'Arc Basin / Flemish Pass Regional Seismic Program, 2012-2020* is no longer required federally as a result of CEAA 2012. However, all other applicable legislative, regulatory and constitutional requirements still must be fulfilled. In particular, safety and environmental protection are priority responsibilities of the C-NLOPB pursuant to the Accord legislation, and the C-NLOPB still must consider the potential environmental effects of activities that are proposed for its authorization.

Accordingly, please be advised that the C-NLOPB will be continuing and completing environmental assessments that were ongoing pursuant to the *Canadian Environmental Assessment Act* prior to July 6, 2012. The C-NLOPB also will continue to post EA related documents on its Web site at http://www.cnlopb.nl.ca/env project.shtml.
