**MG3 (Survey) UK Limited Offshore Labrador Geochemical and Seabed Sampling Program
 2015-2024 Commencement of Environmental Assessment**

On March 31, 2015, MG3 (Survey) UK Limited (MG3) submitted to the Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Offshore Petroleum Board (C-NLOPB) a project description for a geochemical and seabed sampling program. The C-NLOPB determined that the Project would require an authorization pursuant to Section 138(1) (b) of the *Canada-Newfoundland Atlantic Accord Implementation Act* and Section 134(1) (b) of the *Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Atlantic Accord Implementation Newfoundland and Labrador Act*, referred to herein as the Accord Acts.

The attached project description outlines the activities proposed for the seafloor and seep sampling program. Not all datasets will be acquired every year. MG3 is proposing to collect the following data in 2015: conducting MBES at all locations to identify live seeps; sampling of potential natural seabed seeps (by collecting water samples); collection of shallow seabed cores using a gravity core method at up to 200 locations in 2015; conducting seabed heat flow measurements using a thermal probe for the same 200 locations in 2015; and sub-bottom profiler (used when needed).

The C-NLOPB has determined that your agency is in the possession of environmental or fishery related experts that are required in the completion of this assessment.

This letter seeks, pursuant to the Accord Acts, to identify the departments or agencies that may have expertise and to set a timetable for conducting a determination, and seek comments on the attached draft scoping document.

Timing of Assessment

The C-NLOPB requests that the determination be carried out in as timely a manner as possible, and propose the following schedule:

Expertise Request	Response by April 23, 2015
Review of draft EA	Response approximately 4 weeks after receipt of document.
Review of revised EA or addendum, if required	Response approximately 1 week after receipt of document.
Preparation of EA determination	1 week for completion (may commence during review of final EA or addendum); includes review of all drafts.

Pursuant to the Accord Acts, the C-NLOPB requests that you review the attached information and inform the C-NLOPB by **April 23, 2015** of your determination. If you determine that you are

in possession of any specialist or expert information or knowledge please advise the C-NLOPB of the nature of that information or knowledge and the person to contact for assistance by **April 23, 2015**.

If no response is received from you by the date indicated above, the C-NLOPB will assume that your department or agency is not in possession of specialist or expert information or knowledge.

Species at Risk - Section 79(1) Notification of Competent Minister

Pursuant to Section 79(1) of the *Species at Risk Act (SARA)*, the C-NLOPB hereby informs the Minister of Environment and the Minister of Fisheries and Oceans (the Competent Ministers) that the following Schedule 1 Species are likely to be in the project area under the jurisdiction of the C-NLOPB. A determination of the likelihood of adverse affects on these species will be undertaken during the determination process.

- Endangered:
Turtle, Leatherback (*Dermochelys coriacea*)
Whale, Blue (*Balaenoptera musculus*)
Whale, North Atlantic right (*Eubalaena glacialis*)
Gull, Ivory (*Pagophila eburnea*)
Shark, White (*Carcharodon carcharias*)

- Threatened:
Wolffish, Northern (*Anarhichas denticulatus*)
Wolffish, Spotted (*Anarhichas minor*)

- Special Concern:
Wolffish, Atlantic (*Anarhichas lupus*)
Whale, Fin (*Balenoptera physalus*)
Whale, Sowerby's beaked (*Mesoplodon bidens*)
