The EA update is fine, however, I note the following clarification:

In Section 5.1 (page 23) it is stated that "DFO stated that from its point of view seismic surveying does not pose a "serious harm to fish". Our position remains that while the potential exists for seismic surveys to cause serious harm to fish, this potential is reduced significantly through the implementation of mitigation measures / Statement of Canadian Code of Practice / CNLOPB guidelines, hence our insistence on the inclusion of commitments to same within seismic program EAs.

This sentence should be amended to reflect the importance of the implementation of mitigations measures in reducing the potential for seismic surveying to result in serious harm to fish.
