**Decision:**

The Chief Safety Officer accepts the Applicant's, the owner of the *M/V Siem Daya 1*, use of *GL Rules and Guidelines "1-Ship technology, Part 1, Chapter 2, Section 12- Fire Protection and Fire Extinguishing Equipment/Fire Prevention", SOLAS "Reg II-2", & the "Fire Safety Systems Code"*, in lieu of the *Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Offshore Marine Installations and Structures Occupational Health and Safety Transitional Regulations* requirement which specifies the use of Parts 6 & 7 of the "National Fire Code of Canada, 2010".

This approval is subject to the condition that a third party inspection of the fire protection equipment is to be carried out on an annual basis and remains valid during the timeframe of operations under an authorization from the C-NLOPB. A copy of the Third Party inspection report, to the satisfaction of the Chief Safety Officer, is to be provided to the C-NLOPB prior to departure.

This substitution is effective from the date herein until the *Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Offshore Marine Installations and Structures Occupational Health and Safety Transitional Regulations* are repealed or that any representations made in the application for substitution has changed, whichever is earlier. For greater certainty, exemptions from Part III.1 Regulations made pursuant to the Accords Acts will no longer be granted after December 31, 2019.
