Decision:

The Chief Safety Officer approves the Applicant's, the owner of the DSV-Deep Explorer, use of company procedures and the following BS/EN Standards as it relates to fall protection equipment:

- BS EN 341:2011 Personal fall protection equipment descender devices for rescue.
- BS EN 353-2 :2002 Guided type fall arresters (flexible lines)
- BS EN 354:2010 Personal fall protection equipment lanyards
- BS EN 355:2002 Personal protective equipment against falls from height-energy absorbers
- BS EN 358:2018 Personal protective equipment for work positioning and prevention of falls from a height- belts and lanyards for work positioning or restraint
- BS EN 360 :2002 Personal protective equipment against falls from a height- retractable type fall arresters
- BS EN 361:2002 Personal protective equipment against falls from a height-full body harnesses.
- BS EN 362:2004 Personal protective equipment against falls from a height connectors
- BS EN 365:2004 Personal protective equipment against falls from a height. General requirements for instructions for use, maintenance, periodic examination, repair, marking and packaging
- BS EN 813:2008 Personal fall protection equipment-sit harnesses

The standards above, will be used in lieu of the requirements in Subsection 176(2) of the Canada – Newfoundland and Labrador Offshore Marine Installations and Structures Occupational Health and Safety Transitional Regulations which requires the use of CSA Standards for fall protection equipment.

This Decision is effective from the date of issuance herein until the earlier of:



- a) the date a Regulation referenced herein is repealed or the date a particular subsection that is the object of a substitution or exemption being granted hereby is amended or replaced, or
- b) the date on which the CSO and /or CCO (as applicable) revokes this Decision as a result of i) any enforcement action by the Board related to this Decision or ii) new information or analysis coming to light challenging the assessment upon which this Decision was based, including but not limited to any changes to commitments made by the Applicant in its application.

For greater certainty, Chief Safety Officer will no longer have authority under the Accord Acts to grant exemptions for Part III.1 transitional regulations once they are repealed.
