Hello:

I attended the session in St. Anthony and the mapping indicates most of the offshore exploration is outside the 200 mile limit. Some exploration in the Gulf(exploration license given) but again disputed territory with Quebec.

The other areas on the West coast that have not been granted licenses for exploration is areas that may have fracturing..While we are not against this ...we have not got the information to make a decision yet.

The other areas is next to the France's international boundary with Canada. I have not seen any negotiations with France on Fishing in the area. You can drill on the boundary and then go underground and explore the whole area..There are fish in all of those areas ...and I know we have no control of fishing on the Flemish cap,but it may have mitigating factors for fishing for cod, haddock, shrimp and crad. More information is needed and more study needs to be done, even before exploration licenses given, but exploration licenses already given in some instances.
